### GOVERNMENT OF MAHARASHTRA

There are 85 hospitals in Mumbai registered with the Office of Charity Commissioner, Maharashtra. These hospitals are required, under Section 41AA of Bombay Public Trusts Act (BPTA), 1950 to reserve 20% of their beds to free/concessional treatment. This scheme is applicable to COVID-19 & NON-COVID illnesses.

## KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

Dear Friend,

There are 85 hospitals in Mumbai registered with the Office of Charity Commissioner, Maharashtra. These hospitals are required, under Section 41AA of Bombay Public Trusts Act (BPTA), 1950 to reserve 20% of their beds to free/concessional treatment.

These hospitals have received government subsidies and concessions on land, electricity, building rules, income tax and import of medical equipment. In return, they are legally obligated to provide free or concessional (50% subsidy) medical care to economically vulnerable patients.

Facility	Eligibility	% of beds reserved
Free Treatment	Income less than Rs 85,000 p.a.	10%
50% Concession	Income less than Rs.1,60,000 p.a.	10%

Further, according to the order of Bombay High Court in *Abdul Shoeb Sheikh v. K. J Somaiya Hospital* dated 28.06.2020, **proof of income [Yellow/Orange/Antyodaya Anna Yojana Card/Annapurna Scheme card/Income certificate]** should not be demanded *at* the time of admission but can be produced *after* the admission has been secured.

Thus, if you have an income lesser than Rs 85,000/- or Rs 1,60,00/- per annum and find yourself seeking treatment in one of these hospitals, insist that the hospital reveal their reserved bed occupancy and if beds are vacant, DEMAND that you be treated under the respective category.

In case you do not fall under this income category or in the unlikely event that beds are not available under these categories, demand that you be allotted a bed whose prices are being regulated by the state government. Via a notification dated 21<sup>st</sup> May, 2020, price caps have been imposed on 80% of **ALL** beds in private hospitals. The hospital scheme of the Office of the Charity Commissioner and the 80/20 scheme<sup>1</sup> is applicable to both COVID-19 and non COVID illnesses.
