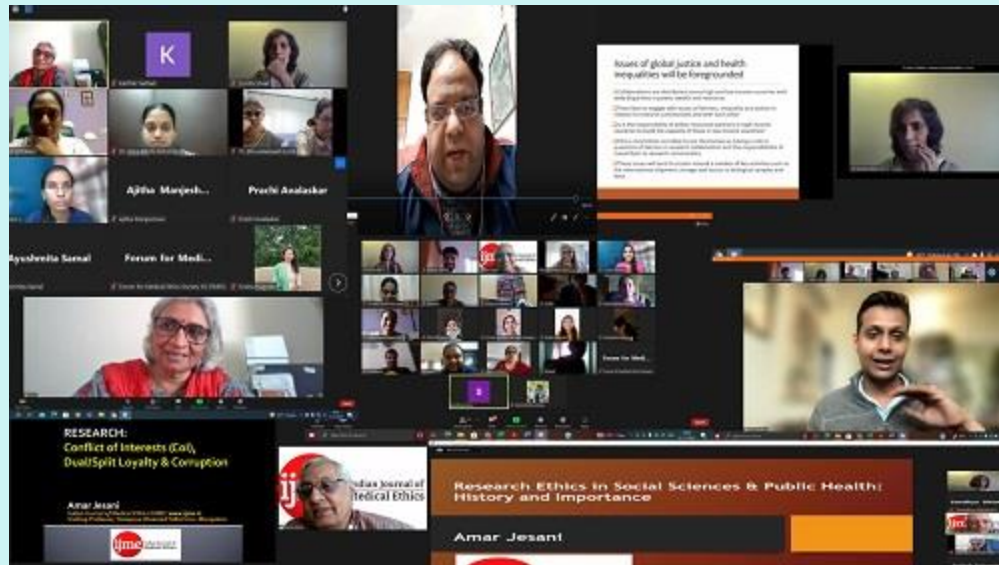
Newsletter Spotlight
