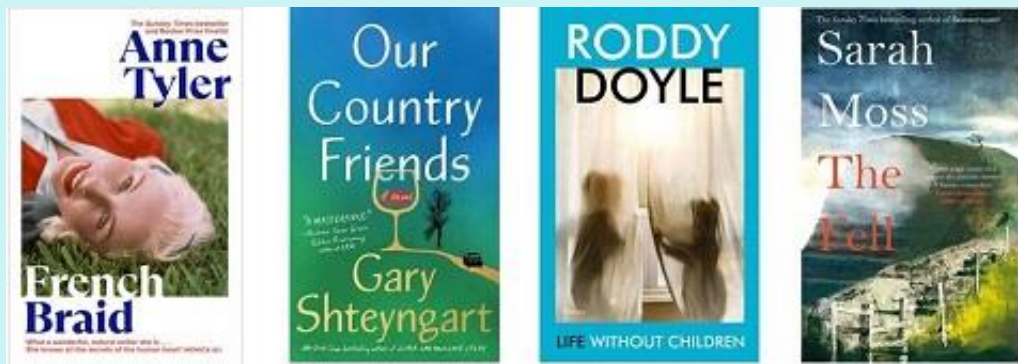

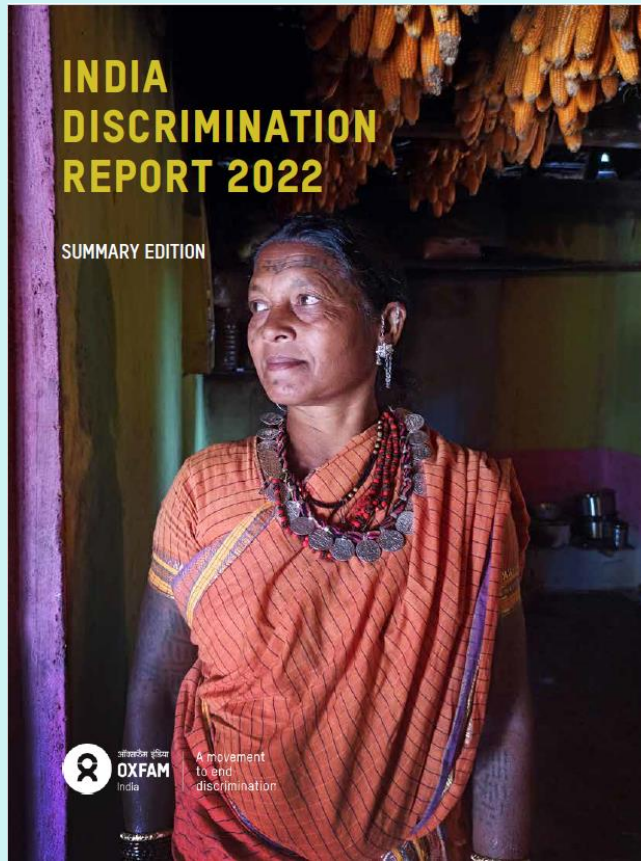

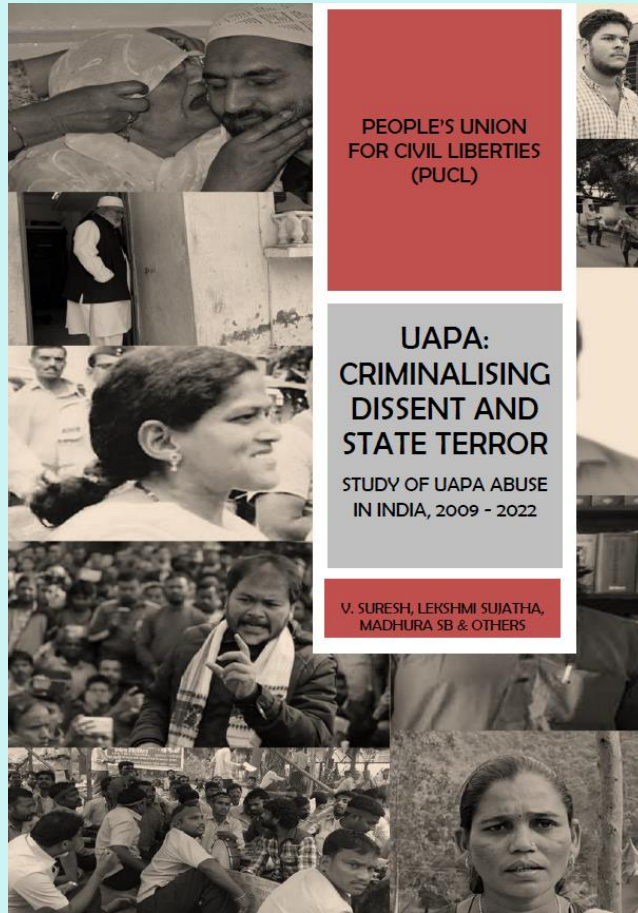

International Safe Abortion Day Campaign 2022 | 28-September

[PHM, SAMA and WGNRR call for making Abortion safe, legal, and accessible for ALL](#)



On 28-September, PHM, SAMA and WGNRR call for reiterating voices stating upfront that Abortion is healthcare and equitable access to safe, legal, and healthcare system provided abortion must not be compromised under any circumstances. Access to healthcare is a human right, and the institutions and governments that fail to recognize and ensure access to abortion as essential healthcare are utterly abrogating their duties to uphold, protect, and fulfil human rights.

September 28 International Safe Abortion Day has its origin in Latin America and the Carribean where women's groups have been mobilising around September 28 since the 1990's. They have been demanding from their governments to decriminalise abortion, to provide access to safe and affordable abortion services and to end discrimination and stigma against women who choose to have an abortion.

The date September 28 was chosen in commemoration of the abolition of slavery in Brazil which is now remembered as the day of the "free womb" demanding safe and legal abortion for all.
